

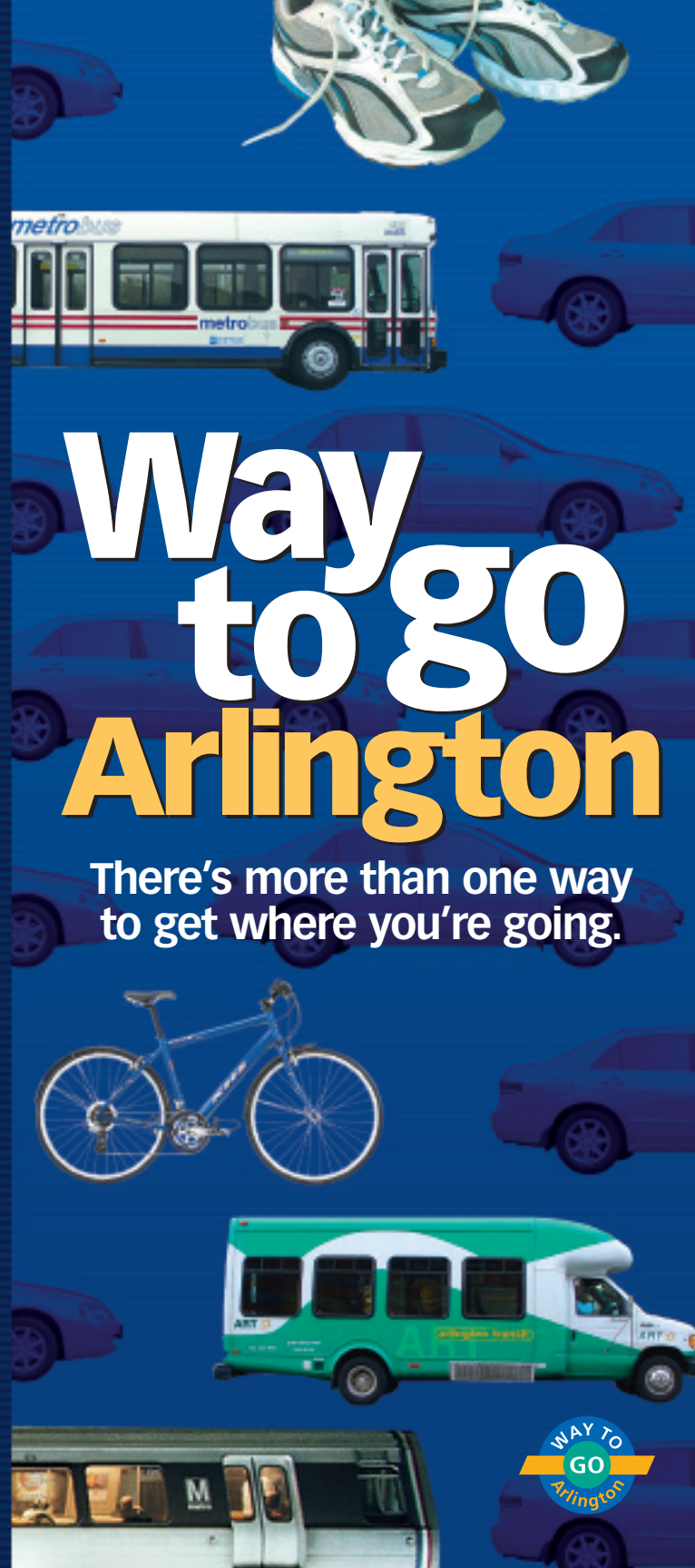

NO CAR REQUIRED. Some of the things that make Arlington such a special place to live and work are the many transportation options. In Arlington, it's easy to get around without taking an SOV (that's Single Occupant Vehicle). So whether you're commuting to work, heading out to play or running a few errands, consider one of these alternatives.

- ▶ **WALKING** It's the original form of transportation. And in Arlington, the goal is to make walking a safe, healthy and enjoyable way to get around. Through the WALKArlington initiative, the county is working to make Arlington's communities more "walkable." Take a step in the right direction, visit WALKArlington.com. See the *Way to Go Arlington Bike/Walk Options* map for information.
- ▶ **BIKING** It's not just great exercise. With Arlington County's 89-mile bikeways system, biking is a viable transportation option. And remember, you can also take your bike on Metrorail, Metrobus and ART. See the *Way to Go Arlington Bike/Walk Options* map for information.
- ▶ **METRO RAIL** Besides being the direct link to Washington, D.C., Metrorail's Orange Line makes it easy to get out and about within Arlington's Urban Villages like Ballston, Clarendon, Court House and Rosslyn. The Blue Line connects you to National Airport, Crystal City, Pentagon City and beyond to Alexandria and Washington, D.C. See the *Way to Go Arlington Transit Options* map for information.

- ▶ **METROBUS** The D.C. area's regional bus service has 18 major bus lines and approximately 99 individual route variations serving Arlington—including Pike Ride which serves the Columbia Pike corridor and 38B which connects Arlington to Georgetown. See the *Way to Go Arlington Transit Options* map for the routes and areas covered by Metrobus.
- ▶ **ART-ARLINGTON TRANSIT** ART bus service operates within Arlington County, providing access to Metrorail and supplementing Metrobus with smaller, Clean Natural Gas (CNG), neighborhood-friendly vehicles. See the *Way to Go Arlington Transit Options* map to locate areas covered by ART-Arlington Transit. STAR (Specialized Transit for Arlington Residents) operates as a part of ART and provides service for individuals with disabilities who are unable to use public transit. For more information, call 703-892-TRIP.
- ▶ **CARPPOOLING/HOV** You can speed your morning and afternoon commutes by taking advantage of HOV (High Occupancy Vehicle) lanes on I-395 and I-66. Did you know that sharing the ride can save you up to \$1,500 a year by lowering your fuel, insurance and car maintenance costs?
- ▶ **CARSHARING** Even people who ride transit, bike and walk need a car sometimes. But that doesn't mean you have to deal with the hassle of car ownership. Carshare instead. It's similar to renting a car. The difference is, with carsharing you can rent the vehicle for

as little as a half-hour. Check the *Way to Go Arlington Transit Options* map to see where you can pick up ZipCar and FlexCar.

- ▶ **TELEWORK** Once or twice a week, forget going into the office. Instead, work from home. To get started, have your employer contact Arlington Transportation Partners (ATP) at 703-247-9299. For more information, visit the ATP section at CommuterPage.com/ATP.

ART-ARLINGTON TRANSIT

ART 41 COURT HOUSE-BALLSTON-COLUMBIA PIKE: Travels between the Columbia Pike west area and the Clarendon and Court House areas. Key stops include the intersection of Columbia Pike and Glebe Rd., Ballston Common Mall, Department of Human Services, Clarendon and Court House Metro stations.

ART 51 BALLSTON-VA HOSPITAL CENTER-EAST FALLS CHURCH: Travels between Ballston-MU Metro and the Virginia Hospital Center.

ART 52 BALLSTON-VA HOSPITAL CENTER-EAST FALLS CHURCH: Travels between Ballston-MU Metro and East Falls Church Metro with a stop at Virginia Hospital Center.

ART 53 BALLSTON METRO-OLD GLEBE-EAST FALLS CHURCH METRO: Travels between Ballston-MU Metro and East Falls Church Metro. Serves the communities of Williamsburg, Chain Bridge Forest, Gulf Branch, Cherrydale and more.

ART 61 ROSSLYN-COURT HOUSE METRO SHUTTLE: Travels between Rosslyn Metro and Court House Metro. Keys stops include Ft. Myer Heights, Radnor Heights, Colonial Terrace, Colonial Village and North Highland neighborhoods.

ART 62 COURT HOUSE METRO-LORCOM LN-BALLSTON METRO: Travels between Court House Metro and Ballston-MU Metro, with stops along Lorcom Ln., Lee Hwy. and Spout Run.

ART 67 BALLSTON-VIRGINIA SQUARE LUNCH LOOP: FREE Ballston-Virginia Square Lunch Loop Shuttles connect you to great stores, restaurants and cafés.

ART 73 ARLINGTON HEIGHTS-PENROSE-PENTAGON CITY: Travels from the Penrose, Arlington Heights and Arlington View areas to Pentagon City Metro and the Fashion Centre at Pentagon City. Key stops include Columbia Pike & Barton St., the Arlington Career Center and the Thomas Jefferson Community Center.

ART 74 NAUCK-DOUGLAS PARK-ARLINGTON VILLAGE-PENTAGON CITY: Travels from the Douglas Park, Arlington Village and Nauck areas to Pentagon City Metro. Key stops include 16th St., 18th St., Glebe Rd., Barton St. and Shirlington Rd. ART 74 travels via I-395 and goes one way both morning and evening.

ART 75 WAKEFIELD H.S.-CARLIN SPRINGS RD.-BALLSTON: Travels between Wakefield High School area and Ballston-MU Metro. Serves the communities of Bluemont, Columbia Heights West, Carlin Springs and Columbia Forrest.

ART 90 CRYSTAL CITY RUSH HOUR SERVICE: Operates on a continuous loop throughout Crystal City during weekday morning and evening rush hours.

METROBUS

1BCDEFZ: Travels between Ballston-MU Metro and Fair Oaks Hospital in Fairfax County. Key stops include Dominion Hills, Seven Corners, Dunn Loring-Merrifield Metro and Inova Fairfax Hospital.

2ABCG: Travels between Ballston-MU Metro and Tysons Corner Center. Key stops include Westover, East Falls Church Metro, Dunn Loring Metro, Vienna Metro and Fair Oaks Mall.

3ABE: Travels from Rosslyn Metro to West Falls Church Metro. Key stops include Lee Hwy. & Glebe Rd., East Falls Church Metro, Annandale Rd. & Rt. 236 and W. Broad & West Sts.

3Y: Travels from Lee Hwy. to K St., NW. Key stops include Lee Hwy. & N. Vermont St., Spout Run Pkwy. & N. Barton St. Travels to D.C. via E St. Expressway to 18th & K Sts. NW.

4ABEHS: Travels from Rosslyn Metro to Sleepy Hollow and Bent Branch Rds. Key stops

include Arlington Blvd. & Pershing Dr., Arlington Blvd. & George Mason Dr., Seven Corners Center and Culmore.

9AE: Travels between Pentagon Metro to Orleans Village. Key stops include Shirlington, Clarendon, North Fairlington and Lincolnia.

7C: Travels between Pentagon Metro and VRE's Lorton station. Key stops include Del Ray, Washington & Kings Sts., Huntington Metro, Rt. 1 & Arlington Dr. and Rt. 1 & Backlick Rd.

10AE: Travels between Pentagon Metro and Hunting Towers. Key stops include Mt. Vernon & Executive Aves., Del Ray, Braddock Road Metro and Washington & King Sts.

10B: Travels between Ballston-MU Metro and Hunting Towers in Alexandria. Key stops include Buckingham, Shirlington, Arlandria, Del Ray, Braddock Road Metro and downtown Alexandria.

10P: Travels from Crystal City Metro to Braddock Road Metro. Key stops include Potomac Yard Center, S. Glebe Rd. & Eads St. and Mt. Vernon Ave. & S. Glebe Rd.

11P: Travels from Crystal City Metro to Hunting Towers. Key stops include Potomac Yard Center, Slaters Ln. & Abindon Dr. and Washington & King Sts.

13B: Travels a loop from Pentagon Metro with stops at 14th & C Sts., 7th St. & Independence Ave., Archives Metro and Constitution Ave. & 22nd St.

16ABDFJ: Travels from Pentagon Metro station to Annandale in Fairfax County. Key stops include the Navy Annex, Columbia Pike & Walter Reed Dr., George Mason Dr., Carlin Springs Rd. and the Culmore area.

16GHKW: Travels from Pentagon City Metro to Dinwiddie & 9th Sts. Key stops include the Navy Annex, Columbia Pike & Walter Reed Dr., Columbia Pike & George Mason Dr., Columbia Pike & Carlin Springs Rd. and George Mason Dr. & Seminary Rd.

16L: Travels from the Pentagon Metro to Annandale via Skyline City.

16Y: Travels from Columbia Pike & Four Mile Run to McPherson Sq. Metro. Key stops

include Court House Metro, 18th St. & Penn. Ave. in the District and Farragut North Metro.

22A: Travels between Ballston-MU Metro and Pentagon Metro. Key stops include Buckingham, Barcroft, Shirlington and Fairlington.

22B: Travels between Pentagon Metro and Shirley Park. Key stops on Army Navy Dr. include S. Hayes, Lynn, 25th and 28th Sts.

23AC: Travels between Crystal Dr. & 18th St. and Tysons-Westpark. Key stops include Ridge Rd. & S. Glebe Rd., Shirlington, Glebe Rd. & Lee Hwy., Langley and Tysons Galleria.

24P: Travels between Ballston-MU Metro and Pentagon Metro. Key stops include the Navy Annex, Court House Metro, Clarendon Metro and Ballston Metro.

25AFGJPR: Travels between Ballston-MU Metro and Pentagon Metro. Key stops include Rt. 7 & Jefferson St., NVCC (Alex. Campus), King & Menokin Sts. in Alexandria and Quincy & 28th Sts.

25B: Travels between Ballston-MU Metro and Van Dorn Street Metro. Key stops include Nova Community Hospital, NVCC (Alex. Campus) and Landmark Center.

38B: Travels between Ballston-MU Metro and Farragut West Metro. Key stops include Clarendon Metro, Court House Metro, Rosslyn Metro, Georgetown and Farragut North Metro.

B11: Travels from Rosslyn Metro to Medical Center Metro. Key stops include Georgetown, Cathedral Heights, Tenleytown-AU Metro and Bethesda Metro.
