

Miscellaneous Metal Parts and Products Surface Coating MACT (Subpart MMMM) training

The Miscellaneous Metal Parts and Products Surface Coating MACT is a complex air rule that will affect about 3,500 facilities nationwide, from large metal coating operations to small job shops, beginning in January 2007.

This 1-day training, developed by EC/R and EPA's Office of Compliance and delivered by EC/R, provides inspectors, permit writers, and regulatory personnel with practical information and compliance tools to allow them to evaluate and/or assist MACT compliance.

The training provides a comprehensive examination of the MACT. Topics include: identifying sources, surface coating processes, applicability criteria, affected sources, emission and operating limits, work practice standards, compliance options, monitoring, and reporting and recordkeeping requirements. Case studies guide attendees through compliance calculations for various facility scenarios. The course notebook includes the training Powerpoint and the following compliance tools:

- step-by-step compliance demonstrations
- work practice, testing, monitoring, recordkeeping, and reporting summary table
- example initial notification and semiannual reports
